CDOS Commencement Credential

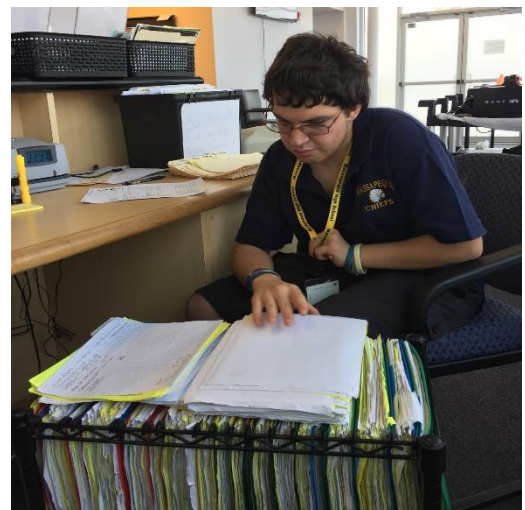
The program allows students to:

High School Heroes continues to be one of the most popular programs offered through the district's School-to-Career Program.

At the completion of the five lessons, students are able to:

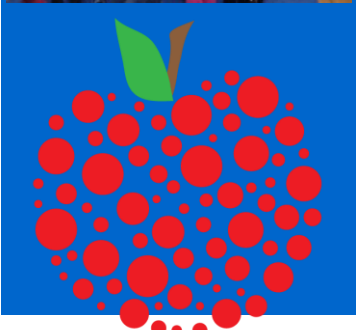
- Describe a community.

- Describe the flow of money in a community's economy.
